Mary is Waiting for You

On August 15, we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Our Catholic Church teaches that Mary, body and soul, was lifted up into heaven and she resides now in glory with her Divine Son. This dogma of our belief was proclaimed by Pope Pius XII in 1950; however, Catholics had celebrated the feast for centuries before the Holy Father's official proclamation. Because of its importance, the feast is designated as a Holy Day of Obligation.

Even though our lives are busy – with responsibilities, obligations and small joys – can we take a few minutes this week to hear Mary speak to us in her beautiful song of praise, her Magnificat? As we listen to Mary, let us recall the teenager, surprised by the angel Gabriel, who was asked to give her body as the place of gestation where humanity and divinity would grow into the Christ Child. With her "Yes," with her "May it be done to me according to your word," (Luke 1:38) Mary's womb became the vessel of the Incarnation. Today, with gratitude to Mary, our bodies too become vessels of the Eucharist and tabernacles of the Jesus Christ.

Doesn't it make perfect sense that God would lift up to heaven the mother of his Beloved Son? And doesn't it make just as much sense that, as we bear Christ in our bodies and make him present to all we encounter, our bodies also will be lifted up in the resurrection to enjoy God's eternal glory?

In the Gospel for the Assumption, we hear Mary respond to her Cousin Elizabeth's greeting with joyful acceptance of God's call. What does Mary say to us as we wait in blessed hope for the resurrection?

- May your soul, may your prayer, proclaim God's greatness, holiness, mercy, and strength.
- In all you do, may you rejoice in the God who lifts up your lowly efforts and comforts a heart that longs for him.
- Remember God's promise to your ancestors and to you that you will be transformed by your good works and Christian witness and will be lifted up in glory.

Members of All Saints and St. Martin de Porres, hear Mary's invitation and respond with an affirming "Yes!" Mary and our Triune God await your arrival in the heavenly kingdom!

TAKING FOOTSTEPS IN FAITH

How has your image of God changed since you were a child? As a child, was your God shaming, angry and vindictive? Or, was God a loving, protective and caring God? As an adult, what is your view of God?

Today's Scriptural readings focus on God's love for us and God's recognition of our taking steps towards affirming our faith...like Peter's bold step of faith when he was able to walk on the water because he believed...until he doubted that he could do so. Peter became scared when he heard the high wind, and he slipped on the water because he doubted that he could continue walking on the water.

Peter had little faith at that moment. But the little faith he had was Peter's step towards discipleship because he was willing to try something new based on his faith in God. And, that is what God loved about Peter who believed he could walk on water...even when he became afraid and slipped in the water until Jesus reached out with love and helped Peter. Peter's faith, although small and interrupted by doubt and fear, was affirmed when he took those steps on the water.

When was the last time you tried something new (no matter how small) as a leap of your faith in God?


