FROM THE PASTOR

PAY ATTENTION TO THE GOOD NEWS OF THE RESURRECTION!

During Holy Week we recall just how bad and hopeless it was for the followers of Jesus Christ with the conflict, the arrest, the bad trial, with torture, death, and burial. All hope seemed lost.

That is what makes this celebration of the Resurrection so remarkable. God conquered all of this and all sin to rise to new life. Now we begin remembering all of Jesus' appearances and words after he rose from the dead. How he breathed the Holy Spirit on his disciples and how his disciples did remarkable things with that gift.

In our society, our individual lives, and even our church, things often look impossible. God IS able to make all of this new. Through healing, forgiveness, teaching, and miracles, God helps us remove our problems, remember the reason to hope, and follow through on the actions we need to take.

For our church, we have a remarkable number of people getting baptized, receiving first communion and confirmation. It is important for all of us to pay attention to this. In the church, us older people get concerned that too few people do too much of the work – let us pay attention to all of these new people to find new workers in the church with their own innovative ideas given to them by the Holy Spirit.

In the past few months, I've met many young adults in our parishes who feel like they are ready to be fully seen as adults in their family, workplace, and in the church. Us older people need to pay attention to this.

For younger people, it might mean paying attention to older people who still have a lot of drive to help. Where do they get all of this idealism after all of these years?

The risen Christ is real and the Spirit we receive in our prayer makes us new in very real ways. As we pay attention to this – our hope is restored so we can honestly give encouragement to others.

- 6. Parish Council meeting for St. Martin de Porres is scheduled for Tuesday, April 9 at 6:00 pm in the Parish Hall. The agenda will focus on choosing a new pastoral council chairperson and continuing to construct teams to fulfill the pastoral planning process we have been in.

Dear Members of Saints Michael, Rose, Martin de Porres, and All Saints Parishes:

It is with a sense of hope for our shared future that we communicate some news with you today. As you may know, Fr. Mike Erwin will be on health leave from April 1st – May 29th. Although he will be back for some special events at the parishes during this time, and then for a few final weeks in early June to say goodbye before his term ends, we ask you to keep him in your prayers for good physical and spiritual health!

During this time frame of Father Mike's health leave, we will be serving as the Interim Parish Administrator, and as the Interim Parish Ministry Coordinator of the communities of Saint Michael, Saint Rose, Saint Martin de Porres, and All Saints. We are eager to guide the parishes during this time of transition as we begin a new chapter in our shared walk of faith. These parishes worship, teach, and serve in the heart of the Central City and we are committed to a vibrant Catholic presence here.

We both have a deep love and knowledge of the four parish communities entrusted to our care. A parish administrator offers the necessary canonical and financial leadership of the parishes during this interim period. The interim ministry coordinator is to be a regular presence to you during this time by listening to you, lifting up your concerns, hearing your hopes, and sharing your visions for your communities. The ministry coordinator walks with you during the day-to-day ministry and operations of the parishes.

As you also may know, a new pastor will be assigned to lead the four parishes beginning in late June. Each of us are committed to our continued work with the staff and leaders of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, along with the trustees of all four parishes, and all of you toward the following purpose:

To strategize and implement viable and sustainable parishes to serve the diversity of Milwaukee's Central City, focused on vibrancy in worship, service, and teaching.

The Archbishop and staff of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee are strongly behind these planning efforts for our Central City parishes, recognizing that the mission and presence of the Catholic Church in the City of Milwaukee is beautifully represented in these four parishes.

Please know of our prayers during this time, and we ask for yours as well. We will be in regular communication with you, and invite your questions and comments as well.
