## HURRICANE HELENE RESPONSE

Catholic Charities USA is providing direct support to Catholic Charities agencies in East Tennessee, Charlotte, South Carolina, Northwest Florida, St. Petersburg, and Venice as they support their devastated communities. Updates as of October 1, 2024 include:

- Several tractor-trailer loads of water are en route to Catholic Charities of East Tennessee and Catholic Charities Diocese of Charlotte.
- A truckload of cleaning kits, diapers, children's activity kits, oral rehydration products, and blankets is en route to Catholic Charities Diocese of St. Petersburg.
- Hygiene kits are being sent to Catholic Charities of South Carolina.
- Catholic Charities locations in Acadiana (LA), Biloxi (MS), Ocala (FL), and Raleigh, and Wilmington (NC) have been established as hub locations to distribute goods regionally.
- Tarps, cleaning kits, and hygiene kits are being sent to the Ocala warehouse.
- 10 tractor-trailer loads of hygiene kits, quilts, and baby kits will be distributed to regional hubs for distribution.
- Solar lights are en route to Catholic Charities of Northwest Florida (Pensacola area) as are blankets to both Pensacola and Catholic Charities of South Carolina.
- The Catholic Charities Acadiana mobile response center is en route to Catholic Charities, Diocese of St. Petersburg.
- Many Catholic Charities agencies outside the affected areas — including Houston, Raleigh, and Sacramento — are assisting with technical needs, case management, and other support services.
- Catholic Charities USA Disaster Response Team members will be on the ground in Tampa and Charlotte in coming days to support disaster relief and recovery efforts by local Catholic Charities agencies.



Dear friends in Christ,

Pope Francis has called us as Christians to "realize that our responsibility within creation, and our duty toward nature and the

Creator are an essential part of our faith." And according to Catholic Social Teaching, care for our common home – the Earth – is a requirement of the Catholic faith.

We have been approached by a new team from the Archdiocese to be a pilot project and model for the Catholic Church in southeastern Wisconsin. We also have been approached by a national faith-based organization. Both the Archdiocese and this organization offer opportunities for funding grants & hands-on assistance. Our four parishes all have been invited – All Saints, St. Martin de Porres, St. Michael, and St. Rose of Lima.

These grants would enable our four parishes to:

- 1. Improve our environmental impact and sustainability
- 2. Increase our energy efficiency
- 3. Improve our outdoor environment
- 4. Help increase local job creation and training
- 5. Save money
- 6. Become a model of creation care.

Someone once said that our faith communities should be leaders in caring for the Earth; we should be the light to the world

Pope Francis recognizes – and these are his words - "the urgency of our environmental challenges." With all this in mind, we are looking to form a Care for Creation Leadership Team with representatives from all four of our parishes to collaborate and support each other in:

- a. Seeking grant money for environmental sustainability projects;
- b. Saving \$\$\$ while we work on addressing energy needs and issues of our aging structures
- c. Developing "Care for Creation" teams at our individual parishes.

We do need to act quickly because some grant deadlines are coming soon. Please prayerfully consider joining this effort at your parish church. Our Food Pantry is a place where our community can receive groceries at a time of need. We serve more than 500 individuals every month, from several zip codes within Milwaukee's inner city.






