MEET YOUR MANAGING DIRECTOR

Here is a chance to meet our recently hired Managing Director, Jim Trzebiatowski.

1. WHERE ARE YOU FROM? WHERE DID YOU GROW UP? I was born and raised on the Southside of Milwaukee.

2. HOW DO YOU SAY YOUR LAST NAME?

This is the question most often asked of me when someone sees my name. While there is a Polish way of saying it, that the late +Fr. Mike Hammer would say, the easiest way to say it is: **TREB-a-TOWS-kee**.

3. FAMILY BACKGROUND?

I am the youngest of two children. My mother lives in Milwaukee and has been a significant influence in my life, particularly in my work within the church. She served as the Parish Secretary and later became the Tour and Gift Shop Manager for the Basilica of St. Josaphat. My father passed away from cancer in 2004; he was an usher and greeter for the Masses. My brother lives in Greenfield and also works for the church. He is currently the Liturgy Director at the Church of the Gesu in Downtown Milwaukee.

4. EDUCATION BACKGROUND?

I attended Catholic school throughout my life. I went to St. Josaphat Parish School for elementary, St. Thomas More for high school, and earned my bachelor's degree in accounting from Cardinal Stritch University.

5. HOME PARISH?

My "home" parish is the Basilica of St. Josaphat in Milwaukee, which served as the foundation for my Catholic education, the sacraments I received, and most of my upbringing. I attribute a significant portion of my personal and spiritual development to the Conventual Franciscans (OFM Conv.), who continue to manage the Basilica to this day.

6. WORK EXPERIENCE?

I began my work life for the Church during high school at the Basilica, starting part-time in maintenance and janitorial services. While in college, I expanded my responsibilities to include various office tasks such as creating the weekly bulletin and worship aids, handling mailings, and assisting in the business office. After graduating from college, I transitioned to a full-time role as the Administrative Assistant. This experience taught me that working in parish life involves taking on multiple responsibilities rather than just one specific job.

In 2019, I moved on from the Basilica to become the Administrative Assistant and eventually the Office Manager at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. There, I collaborated with the different departments within the Cathedral, including communications, music and liturgy, outreach, and the business office.

In 2023. I moved on from the Cathedral to become the Administrative Assistant for the Catholic Social Responsibility department at the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. There, I collaborated with the different departments within the Archdiocese, including communications, outreach, Hispanic ministry, Respect Life, Prison Ministry, and Urban Ministry. This is where I began to work with the Central Milwaukee Catholic Communities (CMCC).

7. ANYTHING ELSE WE SHOULD KNOW?

Thank you for warmly welcoming me to the four parishes. I look forward to assisting the CMCC with the initiatives that Fr. Mike Wolfe has already started. I care about the well-being of these four parishes and am committed to supporting their journey toward greater progress, sustainability and collaboration.

Dear Faithful of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee,

2025 marks a celebration occurring only every 25 years: an Ordinary Jubilee Year. Jubilee years carry a rich tradition in which the people of Israel, freed from slavery, proclaimed liberty to captives and forgiveness to debtors. People returned to their homeland and renewed their trust in God by relying solely on what He provided.

During this Jubilee Year, the Church takes as its beacon: "Hope does not disappoint" (Romans 5:5). As we joyfully anticipate the installation of Archbishop-Designate Jeffrey Grob, I invite you to prepare your hearts to mark this year. In our archdiocese, we will renew our hope in these areas during 2025:

- Hope in God's mercy. Return to and avail yourself often of the essential sacrament of Reconciliation. Churches across the archdiocese will be open and ready to welcome you back on April 9. This will also be a day of reparation and fasting. Acts of reparation are sacrifices we make for an offense, especially a sin. And we will fast on this day in our archdiocese as we atone for sins against those most vulnerable in our world.
- Hope in Jesus' Great Commission that we evangelize. May this year be when we courageously invite
 our loved ones, friends, and strangers to the joy and beauty present every Sunday in the Eucharist. Let
 us love others by inviting them to God's greatest gift on this side of heaven.
- Hope in our marital relationships in the Church. Our parishes will have open arms to those who wish
 to discuss a previous marriage and a possible annulment. And those who married outside the Church
 for whatever reason are warmly invited to discuss celebrating the sacrament of Marriage within the
 Church.
- Hope in our relationship with those who are struggling. I ask us to turn our attention to those laboring in prisons especially. These brothers and sisters suffer silently. We will encourage all to create human connections with those we may not know.

I pray you will mark this Jubilee Year as a special moment in your relationship to God. As I pass on the archdiocese's leadership with immense hope, I ask you to spiritually embrace this Jubilee Year as a time of spiritual renewal. I will remain united with you as a fellow pilgrim of hope. "Hope does not disappoint" (Romans 5:5).

JUBILEE LOGO 2025

The jubilee logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross. It is not only the sign of the faith which this lead figure embraces, but also of hope, which can never be abandoned, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need. There are the rough waves under the figures, symbolising the fact that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. Often the circumstances of daily life and events in the wider world require a greater call to hope. That's why we should pay special attention to the lower part of the cross which has been elongated and turned into the shape of an anchor which is let down into the waves. The anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency manoeuvres to stabilise the ship during storms. It is worth noting that the image illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking, but rather as something communal, marked by an increasing dynamism leading one ever closer to the cross. The cross in the logo is by no means static, but it is also dynamic. It bends down towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. At the bottom of the logo is the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year: Peregrinantes in Spem (Pilgrims in hope), represented in green letters.

THE JUBILEE PRAYER

Father in heaven, may the faith you have given us in your son, Jesus Christ, our brother, and the flame of charity enkindled in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, reawaken in us the blessed hope for the coming of your Kingdom.

May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel.


