FROM THE DESK OF OUR PAROCHIAL ADMINISTRATOR

February 2025

Dear friends in Christ,

In last month's bulletin we included information on the jubilee year, which we celebrate in the Church every 25

years. For this year, Pope Francis has invited us to focus on Christian hope, reminding us through our baptism, we are all called to be "Pilgrims of Hope."

Being a pilgrim means we are always on a journey, always "on the way." This is so central to the Christian life that the first followers of Christ were known as "the way." And regarding hope, we must remember that hope is not a wish, but



rather it is a sense of expectation based on a trust of what is to come. Announcing the jubilee, Pope Francis wrote:

In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring. Even so, uncertainty about the future may at times give rise to conflicting feelings, ranging from confident trust to apprehensiveness, from serenity to anxiety, from firm conviction to hesitation and doubt. Often we come across people who are discouraged, pessimistic and cynical about the future, as if nothing could possibly bring them happiness. For all of us, may the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope. (Spes non confundit, 1)

Being dedicated pilgrims of hope is important for not just ourselves individually, not just our parishes, but for all those around us. And within the collaboration of our four parishes what we have to offer, amongst many other things, is to demonstrate how Christian hope unites us. This is a sign that is especially important in the times of much division.

My prayer is that as we continue to journey together, we overcome all the possible conflicting feelings that the Pope mentions which can cause us to become a stumbling block to hope, and rather that we lift up each other in the hope of which is to come. A beautiful opportunity to do precisely this is in the upcoming Mass of Welcome for Archbishop Grob that we will host at St. Michael's on Sunday, March 30 at 2:00 pm. I asked for it to be at this time because it is my hope that this be an opportunity to showcase our diversity while united in the Eucharist and with our chief shepherd in Milwaukee.

I continue to give thanks to God for the opportunity to journey on "the way" with all of you. Our parishes, and your individual witnesses of faith, strengthen my confidence that "Hope does not disappoint," (Rom 5:5). God bless,

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE GE'EZ RITE CATHOLIC CHURCH

THE GE'EZ CHRISTIAN TRADITION

The early Church was divided according to the Apostolic Tradition or Patriarchates (Sees). For example, Rome, the See of St. Peter, Antioch the foundation of the Syriac Church tradition, Alexandria the See of St. Mark the Evangelist and a disciple of St. Peter, Byzantine the See of St. Andrew the Apostle, Jerusalem, the See St. James also known as the brother of Jesus. Additional Church traditions include the Armenian and Chaldean Churches. However, these churches are divided into East and West. The West or the Latin Rite include additional traditions, such as Mozarabic, Ambrosian, Roman and Monastic Rites. The East is further divided into Byzantine and Oriental Rites the comprise of Syriac, Armenian, Chaldean and Alexandrian traditions. Under the Alexandrian Tradition are the Coptic, Ge'ez and Nubian (extinct since 16th century).

Ge'ez is the liturgical language of the Catholic and Orthodox Churches in Eritrea and Ethiopia. Ge'ez is also known as Ethiopic, is one of the first few ancient languages that the Bible was translated into, in the 4th and 5th centuries C.E.

According to some Biblical scholars, Ge'ez words are also present in some Hebrew Scriptures (OT). Certain extracanonical writings are extant in their full version only in the Ge'ez, e.g. the Book of Enoch, the Book of Jubilees, etc.

Ge'ez Christian tradition is the oldest in existence in the Sub-Saharan Africa. It traces its origin to the time of the Apostles. In recorded history, Christianity became the state religion of the Axumite Empire (the cradle of Ethiopian and Eritrean civilization) in 330's C.E. The Axum was the first Christian Empire to mint coins with Christian symbol of the cross. In the following centuries, monasteries after the examples of St. Anthony of the Desert (anchorite) and St. Pachomius (cenobite) practices were established. In the Ge'ez Orthodox Christian monastic lifestyle and the liturgical practices have made very little changes throughout the centuries.

The Ge'ez Liturgy also resembled the Jewish Temple Liturgy of the ancient times. In the Middle Ages, European visitors noticed such a resemblance. The composition of the Ge'ez liturgical hymn known as ziema is credited to St. Yared of the 6th century. The Ge'ez Rite Catholic Church has 17 Eucharistic Prayers two of which are dedicated to Mary, Our Lady the Mother of God.

The Ge'ez Christian tradition unique African essence can be witnessed by the lively liturgical celebration, which include, sacred drums, sistrum, liturgical dance, spontaneous ululation by women, etc. This is a clear testimony of its unique African identity and antiquity. Therefore, Ge'ez rightly called the sacred language of this ancient Christian tradition.

In North America, there are about 10,000 Ge'ez Rite Catholics. Pope Francis appointed an Apostolic Visitor for this nascent faith community in 2022. The small Ge'ez Rite Catholic community in Milwaukee, WI, is known as "Mariam Tsion Faith Community – Mary of Zion" recognized by Archbishop Jerome Listecki in 2013.






